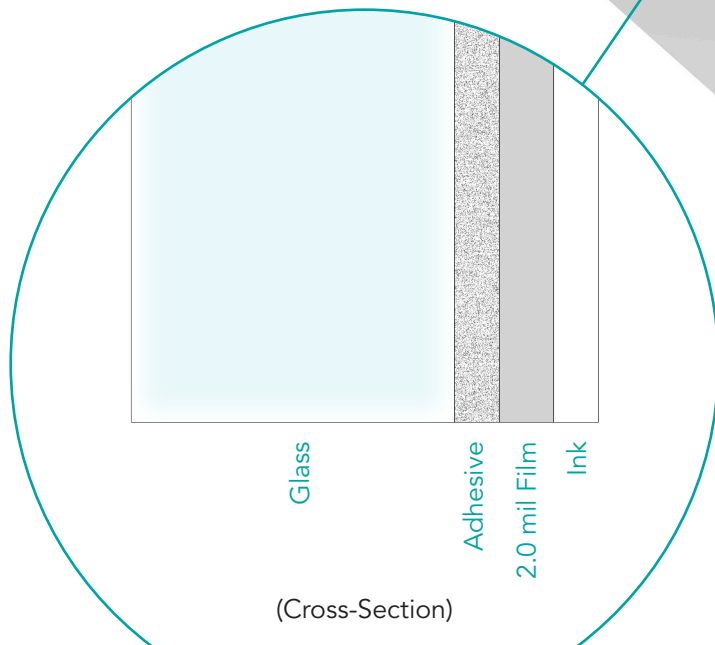
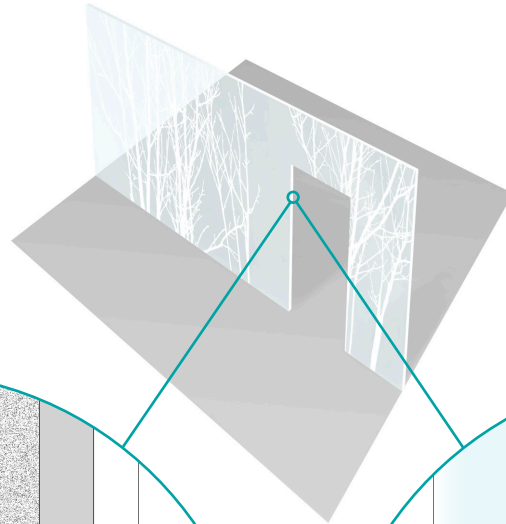


Window Film: Polyester vs. Polycarbonate

POLYESTER

Our Most Common Window Film

Less Expensive than Polycarbonate

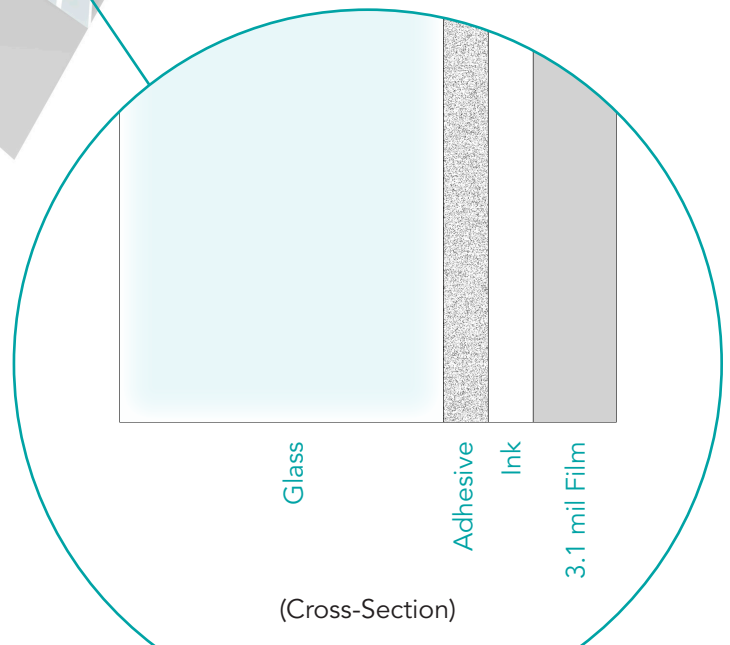
Ink is Applied to Exposed Surface of the Film

Highly Durable, but Exposed Ink Could be Subject to Wear in Heavy Traffic Areas*

Optically Clear • Self-Adhesive • Wet Install

2.0 mil • Available in 60" Wide Rolls

*An optional over-laminate is available to encapsulate the ink; applied about one week after installation.



POLYCARBONATE

More Expensive than Polyester

Ink is Applied to the Inside Surface of the Film, Completely Encapsulating the Ink Between the Film and Glass

Ideal for Areas with Heavy Traffic or Contact

Optically Clear • Self-Adhesive • Wet Install

3.1 mil • Available in 48" Wide Rolls
